## Call for Papers

Persons wishing to make a presentation must submit a proposal with the title and an abstract of no more than 200 words. Please submit proposals electronically through the Psychometric Society Web site ([www.psychometricsociety.org](http://www.psychometricsociety.org)) by March 15, 2008.

Each person is permitted to present only one contributed paper. Keynote and invited speakers are also welcome to submit one contributed paper. There is no limit to the number of papers for which a presenter may be listed as a co-author.

Proposals for poster sessions are also being accepted. Although proposals may be submitted for an oral or poster presentation, the program committee determines the final mode of presentation. Overhead and LCD projectors are available for oral presentations.

## Proposals should include the following information:

- Name, institutional affiliation, mailing address, and e-mail address of primary contact
- Name of presenter
- Names of co-authors
- Mode of presentation (oral or poster session)
- Title of presentation
- Topic area (see the list of topic categories)
- An abstract of no more than 200 words
