The Program in Research, Evaluation, Measurement and Statistics (REMS) in the College of Education at the University of Georgia is pleased to announce a tenure-track position to be filled at the rank of Assistant or Associate Professor. The position is for a scholar whose research focuses on quantitative methods. There is particular interest in a scholar whose program of research uses and develops model-based statistical methods for the study of complex behavioral and educational phenomena. The successful candidate will be a member of the REMS faculty with a tenure home in the Department of Educational Psychology and Instructional Technology. Those who apply for the Associate Professor Position should have evidence of a strong teaching record, significant scholarly writing, and evidence of application for granted research.

Qualifications include an earned doctorate at the time of employment with specialization in Educational Statistics, Quantitative Psychology, Educational Measurement or a closely related field, a record of scholarly research in an area relevant to the REMS program, and potential for obtaining external research funding. Strong computer and interpersonal skills are essential. Responsibilities of this position include teaching the equivalent of two courses per semester, maintaining an active research program, mentoring students, directing theses and dissertations, seeking external funding, and participating in faculty governance. Compensation is highly competitive with excellent benefits. Anticipated start date for the position is August, 2012.
