Visiting Senior Research Specialists (Biostatisticians)

The Institute for Health Research and Policy (IHRP) at UIC seeks to expand its Methodology Research Core by adding two Visiting Senior Research Specialists (SRS). Members of the Methodology Research Core provide biostatistical support to principal investigators, from study development through analysis and interpretation; and pursue their own research interests. Quantitatively and qualitatively orientated scholars are encouraged to apply. IHRP is engaged in a wide range of health-related studies including community interventions, school-based prevention, health behavior change; IHRP research incorporates diverse urban populations. The SRS positions require a Ph.D. in biostatistics, statistics or a relevant discipline with a substantial concentration in research methodology and two years' training and demonstrated experience in a scientific research environment. Visiting Research Data Management Analyst

The Institute for Health Research and Policy (IHRP) at UIC seeks to expand its Methodology Research Core by adding a Visiting Research Data Manager (RDM). This position will be responsible for organizing, documenting and assisting in the analysis of complex data sets, including survey, administrative and clinical data, and work closely with multiple investigators with diverse data and analysis requirements. The ideal applicant should be familiar with various statistical packages such as SAS or SPSS (R and Stata also useful) and other file formats such as spreadsheets, SQL and MS Access, and be familiar with basic statistical methods including logistic regression. The Visiting RDM's tasks include but are not limited to setting up file storage systems, merging and aggregating data sets and managing complex file structures such as hierarchical data files. The Visiting RDM will also handle documentation of data files and maintaining records of procedures used to collect, clean, create, modify, and analyze data. Required: Bachelor's degree (master's preferred) and a minimum of two years' experience in the manipulation and management of large data sets.
