The Department of Educational Psychology at Ball State University has a full-time tenure-track position at the Assistant Professor level beginning August 22, 2008. Teaching responsibilities for this position will include graduate courses in statistics and research methods, and may include graduate and undergraduate courses in tests and measurement. The research methods and statistics courses serve graduate programs within the department as well as throughout Teachers College and the University. The applicant's research specialty is open, but preference will be given to areas that most closely match the needs of the various department programs. Research, publication, and working with graduate students in both school and educational psychology are expected. In addition, opportunities for statistical consulting and research collaboration exist across the university.

Ball State University is a nationally recognized public university in Muncie, Indiana, positioned less than an hour's drive from both Indianapolis and Fort Wayne. The university holds national recognitions and rankings in computer technology (number one wireless campus in the nation), broadcasting, entrepreneurship, and teacher education. The university's close proximity to Indianapolis and Fort Wayne provide educational psychology faculty with opportunities to engage in professional service activities, including consultation and research collaborations, in school districts across the state.

The Department of Educational Psychology (www.bsu.edu/edpsych) offers masters and doctoral programs in educational psychology and an APA/NASP-approved doctoral program and a NASP-approved masters/Ed.S program in school psychology. In addition, the department offers graduate concentrations in research methods, measurement, development, and gifted studies. At the undergraduate level, the department provides the developmental and educational psychology courses for the teacher preparation sequence, for the minor in human development, and for the psychology concentration in elementary education. Course sequences for a concentration in gifted education are offered at both the undergraduate and graduate levels.

Minimum Qualifications: Doctorate in Research Methods or Statistics or related field of Psychology completed by August 22, 2008.

Preferred Qualifications: Experience in statistical consultation and university teaching.

Applicants should send a letter of application, curriculum vitae, graduate transcripts, and three letters of recommendation mailed by the respondents to Dr. Holmes Finch, Personnel Selection Committee, Department of Educational Psychology, Teachers College 524, Ball State University, Muncie, IN 47306-0595. Review of applicants will begin October 15, 2007 and continue until the position is filled.
